Recommendations

- Our first question to one another should be “how are the children?”
- Children need permanency including relational and cultural permanency
- Listen to people with lived experience, and fund opportunities for peer support
- Fund culturally based programs and indigenous frameworks for program evaluation. Modify the “evidence based” criteria of the Family First Prevention Services Act to tap into tribal and cultural wisdom
- Support ways in which children and young people have authentic voices in case planning and decision making
