We acknowledge that we live & work on Indigenous Land that is now home to citizens of many diverse nations, including Tribal nations.








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

Lack of Academic Preparation: 30-60 percent Developmental Ed; Behavioral & General Health Issues: Suicide, Depression, Gangs, Alcohol, Violence, Diabetes, Obesity

Lack of Fiscal Resources: Chronic underfunding; lack of funding sustainability in key

programs: student support, GED prep, childcare, Land-grant Extension






Geographic, Infrastructure, and Socio-Economic Challenges & Barriers: Over 50 percent of students = 1st generation; several TCU reservations are larger than some states



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








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Bay Mills Community College this year will celebrate its first entirely online baccalaureate graduates – in Early Childhood Education.


















TCU Equitable Practices

- Education & Research RELEVANT to community and family




